Technical Feasibility

Fusion splicing is the standard method for joining two fiber optic pigtails. The process involves aligning the bare ends of the fibers and using an electric arc to melt and fuse the glass together, forming a continuous optical path. A properly executed fusion splice has an insertion loss of 0.01–0.05 dB and virtually no back reflection, making it ideal for high-performance networks. This method is preferred over mechanical splicing for permanent, low-loss connections, especially in backbone or long-haul networks. Mechanical splicing is an alternative, where fibers are aligned in a sleeve with index-matching gel. While faster and requiring no expensive splicer, it typically introduces higher insertion loss (0.20–0.50 dB) and is less reliable for critical applications.

Required Equipment

To fuse two pigtails, you need:

- Fusion Splicer: Aligns and melts the fiber ends to create a seamless joint.
- Fiber Strippers: Remove the protective coating without damaging the glass.
- Cleaver: Cuts the fiber ends precisely for optimal fusion.
- Cleaning Tools: Ensure dust-free surfaces for minimal signal loss.
