

Class 1 laser diodes



Overview

A class 1 laser product is a device that complies with laser safety standards from the International Electrotechnical Commission (IEC). These regulations ensure that lasers identified with a “Class 1 laser product” label are safe. It will be listed either in Arabic numerals (1, 2, 3R, 3B, 4) or in Roman numerals (I, II, IIIa, IIIb, IV). Since even relatively small amounts of laser light can lead to permanent eye injuries, the sale and usage of lasers is typically subject to. Laser Diodes and Modules are semiconductor devices that can emit a beam of high intensity focused radiation, typically in the infrared, visible or ultraviolet wavelength ranges of the electromagnetic spectrum, coherently (light waves of the same wavelength, phase and direction).

This awareness is not just a matter of time spent with lasers; to the contrary, long-term dealing with invisible risks (such as from infrared laser beams) tends to reduce risk awareness, rather than to sharpen it, primarily due to complacency.
