

Configuration Requirements for Industrial Secondary Distribution Boxes

Industrial secondary distribution boxes must be configured based on load capacity, voltage levels, protection requirements, environmental conditions, and compliance with relevant standards.

Load and Capacity Considerations

Before configuring a secondary distribution box, calculate the total power demand of the facility, including continuous loads (e.g., production lines, pumps) and intermittent loads (e.g., maintenance equipment) to determine the rated current for each box and avoid overloads . Strategically distribute high-power and low-power circuits to minimize cable lengths, reduce power losses, and ensure balanced load distribution .

Voltage and Circuit Separation

Industrial facilities often operate at multiple voltage levels (e.g., 400V, 1kV, 10kV). Secondary distribution boxes should separate different voltage systems to prevent interference and ensure safe operation . Busbars, terminal blocks, and circuit breakers should be sized according to the voltage and current requirements of each circuit .

Protection Requirements

Select boxes with appropriate protection devices based on fault risks such as short circuits, overcurrent, and arc faults. Options include circuit breakers, fuses, surge protectors, and microprocessor-based protection devices with fast response times (
