Purpose of the Identification Table

The identification table serves to:

- Clearly label each circuit and breaker in the distribution box.
- Indicate voltage, phase, and amperage ratings for each circuit.
- Identify the equipment or area served by each circuit.
- Facilitate maintenance, troubleshooting, and safety inspections.
- Ensure compliance with local electrical codes and standards for temporary construction wiring .
