

Core Switch Configuration Methods



Article Overview

Core switch configuration involves setting up basic management, VLANs, port settings, and advanced features like redundancy, backplane optimization, and module scalability.

Initial Setup

- **Connect to the Switch Console:** Use a terminal emulator like PuTTY to connect via a serial console or SSH/Telnet if the switch is already networked. Set the correct COM port and baud rate (commonly 9600 or 115200) to access the CLI .
- **Enter Privileged EXEC Mode:** Type enable to access privileged mode, then enter Global Configuration Mode with configure terminal .
- **Set Hostname and Domain Name:** Assign a unique hostname for identification and configure the domain name for SSH key generation .
- **Configure Management IP:** Assign an IP address to the management VLAN to allow remote administration. Set a default gateway if the switch needs to communicate outside its subnet .
- **Secure Access:** Configure passwords for console, VTY (Telnet/SSH), and enable secret passwords. Optionally, integrate with AAA servers for centralized authentication .

VLAN and Port Configuration

- **Create VLANs:** Define VLANs for network segmentation using vlan and assign names for clarity.
