

Distance between two cable trays in the computer room



Article Overview

In a computer room, cable trays should be spaced at least 0.6 meters apart horizontally, with a minimum vertical clearance of 150 millimeters, and power and signal trays separated by at least 0.5 meters to ensure safety, maintenance access, and proper airflow.

Horizontal Spacing

When installing two cable trays in parallel at the same height, the minimum horizontal distance should be 0.6 meters. This spacing allows technicians to perform maintenance, inspect cables, and ensures proper airflow for heat dissipation, reducing the risk of short circuits or interference. For power and signal cable trays, a horizontal separation of at least 0.5 meters is recommended to minimize electromagnetic interference (EMI). If the trays are shielded, this distance can be reduced to 0.3 meters.

Vertical Spacing

For floor-mounted or stacked trays, a minimum vertical clearance of 150 millimeters is advised. This prevents obstruction, maintains structural integrity, and facilitates future installation, ventilation, and cooling.
