

Distribution Box Numbering Rules

Distribution box numbering ensures organized, safe, and traceable electrical circuits by assigning unique identifiers to each breaker, panel, or sub-circuit.

Purpose of Numbering

Numbering in distribution boxes is essential for:

- **Safety:** Quickly identifying circuits during maintenance or emergencies.
- **Organization:** Clear mapping of incoming and outgoing circuits.
- **Maintenance and Troubleshooting:** Facilitates locating faults and performing repairs efficiently.
- **Automation and Monitoring:** Enables integration with smart systems for monitoring and control .

General Principles

- **Sequential Numbering:** Circuits are numbered in order, typically from left to right or top to bottom within the panel .
- **Hierarchical Structure:** Main distribution panels are numbered first, followed by sub-panels and individual breakers. For example, a main panel may be labeled 1AP, with sub-panels 1AL1, 1AL2, etc. .
- **Unique Identifiers:** Each breaker or circuit must have a unique number to avoid confusion. This can include floor, location, and type codes (e.g., 1AL1B for a type B distribution box on the first floor), .
