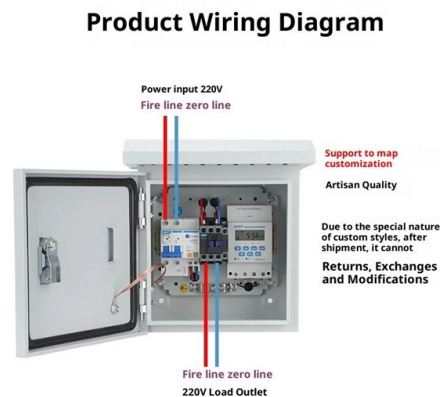


How to connect the top and bottom incoming cables to the network cabinet



Article Overview

Incoming network cables should be routed carefully through designated top or bottom entry points, secured, and organized to maintain accessibility, safety, and performance.

Planning and Preparation

Before connecting cables, plan the cabinet layout: identify which devices (switches, patch panels, routers) will be installed, determine port requirements, and decide whether redundancy or failover is needed . Measure cable lengths to avoid excess slack or tension, and leave 10-15 cm of extra length for flexibility and future adjustments . Ensure power and network cables are separated to prevent interference .

Routing Cables

- **Top Entry:** Typically used for incoming backbone or uplink cables. Route cables along the cabinet frame, avoiding sharp bends or crossing other cables . Use vertical cable managers or cable trays to guide cables neatly to patch panels or switches .
- **Bottom Entry:** Often used for horizontal cabling from workstations or local devices. Feed cables through the bottom openings, keeping them aligned with the cabinet's vertical cable channels . Avoid compressing cables under equipment or obstructing airflow .
