

How to use pigtails in the fiber distributor box

Fiber optic pigtails are installed in a distribution box by splicing the bare fiber end to incoming cables and connecting the factory-terminated end to adapters or equipment ports.

Understanding Fiber Pigtails

A fiber optic pigtail is a short fiber cable with a pre-installed connector on one end and a bare fiber on the other. The connector end plugs into adapters, patch panels, or active equipment, while the bare end is fusion or mechanically spliced to the incoming fiber cable inside the distribution box. Pigtails are commonly used in single-mode and multimode networks and are essential for achieving low-loss, reliable terminations.

Steps to Install Pigtails in a Distribution Box

- **Prepare the Fiber Distribution Box** Open the box and ensure the splice tray or adapter panel is accessible. Organize incoming fiber cables to avoid bending or stress.
- **Strip and Clean the Incoming Fiber** Remove the protective jacket and buffer from the incoming fiber to expose the bare glass. Clean the fiber with isopropyl alcohol to remove dust and debris.
- **Splice the Pigtail to the Incoming Fiber**
 - **Fusion Splicing:** Align the bare fiber of the pigtail with the incoming fiber in a fusion splicer. The splicer melts the fibers together, creating a low-loss joint.
