A fiber optic patch cord functions as a flexible bridge that connects optical devices, transmitting light signals with minimal loss to enable high-speed data communication.

Core Function

A fiber optic patch cord, also known as a fiber jumper or fiber patch cable, is a short, factory-terminated optical cable with connectors at both ends. Its primary function is to connect network devices or link devices to fiber optic patch panels, allowing optical signals to travel efficiently between equipment (). It does not generate signals; instead, it transmits light signals produced by devices such as lasers or LEDs, maintaining signal integrity through total internal reflection within the fiber core ().

Structure and Performance

Patch cords are composed of several layers: a core with a high refractive index for light transmission, a cladding with a lower refractive index to reflect light back into the core, strength members like aramid yarns for durability, and a protective outer jacket (). The connectors at each end (e.g., SC, LC, ST, FC) ensure secure, low-loss connections to devices or panels ().
