

Methods for threading fiber optic cables

Use the right threader tool, proper lubrication, and careful handling to safely and efficiently pull fiber optic cables through conduits.

Choose the Right Threader Tool

Select a threader tool suitable for your cable type and conduit layout. Common options include:

- Steel Fish Tape: Durable, ideal for long, straight runs.
- Fiberglass Fish Tape: Lighter and flexible, suitable for bends and shorter runs.
- Nylon Fish Tape: Non-conductive, safe near live wires.
- Cable Pulling Rope or Vacuum Threader Systems: Useful for heavier cables or complex conduit paths .

Prepare the Cable

Before threading, ensure the fiber optic cable is properly prepared:

- Strip the outer jacket carefully without damaging the fiber.
- Clean the exposed fiber with an IPA-soaked swab to remove oils and debris.
- Maintain a minimum bending radius (typically >30 mm) to prevent microbends or breaks .
