

Minimum distance from distribution box



Article Overview

The minimum distance from a distribution box depends on its type: for electrical boxes, at least 3 feet (0.9 meters) in front and 30 inches (0.76 meters) on the sides; for septic system distribution boxes, typically 5 to 10 feet from the septic tank.

Electrical Distribution Box Clearance

For electrical distribution boxes, proper clearance is essential for safety, maintenance, and emergency access:

- **Front Clearance:** Minimum of 3 feet (0.9 meters) in front of the panel to allow doors to open at least 90 degrees and provide safe working space .
- **Side Clearance:** At least 30 inches (0.76 meters) from the sides of the equipment, or the width of the equipment if greater .
- **Height Clearance:** Minimum headroom of 6½ feet (2 meters) or the height of the equipment, whichever is greater .
- **Unobstructed Space:** Ensure at least 0.6 meters of free space around the box for domestic setups, and 1 meter for commercial or industrial setups .
- **Access and Emergency Exits:** Switchboard rooms should have doors at least 0.9 meters wide and 2.2 meters high, opening outward without keys or tools, with multiple exit paths for large or high-capacity panels . These clearances are designed to prevent accidents, allow electricians to work safely, and comply with standards such as NEC and AS/NZS 3000 .
