

Overload of distribution box circuit

A distribution box circuit overload occurs when the electrical current exceeds the safe capacity of the circuit, causing breakers to trip to prevent overheating and potential fires.

What Causes a Circuit Overload

A circuit overload happens when the total current drawn by appliances and devices exceeds the circuit's rated capacity, typically 15 or 20 amps in residential systems . Common causes include:

- Excessive power demand: Using multiple high-wattage appliances (heaters, microwaves, air conditioners) on the same circuit .
- Faulty or outdated wiring: Deteriorated or undersized wires increase resistance and reduce safe capacity .
- Overuse of extension cords: Daisy-chaining extension leads can add extra load .
- Circuit breaker malfunction: A faulty breaker may fail to trip, increasing fire risk .

Signs of an Overloaded Circuit

- Frequent tripping of breakers or blown fuses .
- Dimming lights or flickering when multiple devices are used .
- Unusual appliance noises or a burning smell near outlets .
- Warm or scorched plugs indicating overheating .
