- LC (Lucent Connector): A smaller form factor connector suitable for high-density applications.
- ST (Straight Tip): A bayonet-style connector often used in legacy networks.
- FC (Ferrule Connector): A threaded connector providing high precision and low back-reflection, commonly used in measurement and high-power applications .

Key Parameters

- Insertion Loss (IL): The amount of signal power lost when connecting fibers; lower IL indicates better performance.
