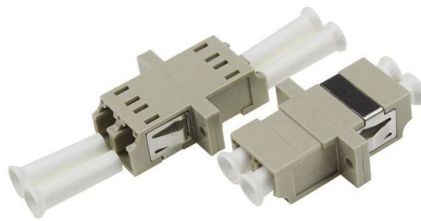


Reasons for phasing out fiber optic switches
