

Router Ports and Fiber Optic Ports

A fiber optic connection requires an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) to convert light signals into electrical signals, which then connect to a router via its WAN or SFP port.

Understanding the Connection

Fiber optic internet transmits data as light pulses through thin glass or plastic fibers, offering high speeds and low latency. However, standard routers cannot directly interpret these optical signals. The Optical Network Terminal (ONT), usually provided by your ISP, serves as the intermediary device that converts the incoming light signal into an electrical signal compatible with your router .

Router Requirements

To use fiber internet, your router must have a WAN port or a compatible SFP/SFP+ port. The WAN port is typically labeled and may be colored differently to distinguish it from LAN ports. Some high-end routers also support direct fiber connections via SFP modules, which allow multi-gigabit speeds . Ensure the router can handle the speed provided by your ISP to fully leverage fiber's performance.

Step-by-Step Connection

- **Install the ONT:** Connect the fiber optic cable from the wall outlet to the ONT's optical port. Power on the ONT and wait for the status lights to stabilize .
- **Connect ONT to Router:** Use a high-quality Ethernet cable (Cat6a or higher) to link the ONT's Ethernet output to the router's WAN port. For routers with SFP ports, an SFP module may be used for direct fiber input .
