

Spacing between electrical cables and optical fiber cables



Article Overview

Maintain at least 12 inches (300 mm) separation between unshielded optical fiber and power cables, with reduced distances possible using barriers, shielding, or separate raceways.

General Guidelines

Optical fiber cables are immune to electromagnetic interference (EMI), but nearby electrical power cables can still affect associated communications equipment or induce mechanical stress. Standards such as NEC 2026, TIA-568, TIA-569, and NESC provide guidance for safe and reliable installations . Key points include:

- Unshielded fiber vs. power cable: Maintain a minimum of 12 inches (300 mm) separation unless a listed barrier or separate raceway is used .
- Shielded fiber or data cables: Separation can be reduced to 6 inches (150 mm) if shielding is present .
- Metal conduit or separate metallic raceways: No separation is required when both systems are in separate grounded metallic conduits .
- High-voltage or high-current power lines: For aerial installations, midspan clearances may require 12 inches, while at supports, clearances can be 30 inches depending on bonding and NESC rules .

Installation Best Practices

- Separate trays or compartments: Use divider brackets or compartmentalized trays to isolate fiber from high-voltage or high-current cables .
