

Spacing of cable tray integrated support



Article Overview

The typical spacing between cable tray supports ranges from 1.5 meters to 3 meters for horizontal runs, with adjustments based on tray type, load, and installation conditions.

Horizontal Support Spacing

For straight horizontal cable tray runs, supports (such as brackets or hangers) are generally spaced between 1.5 meters and 3 meters apart. This range ensures stability, prevents sagging, and allows for maintenance access and heat dissipation . At corners or bends, additional supports should be installed on each side to prevent stress on the cables . The exact spacing may vary depending on the tray type, material, and total cable load, and should follow the manufacturer's load capacity chart .

Vertical and Angled Runs

For vertical cable tray runs, supports should be fixed to the building structure with a spacing preferably less than 2 meters to maintain stability and prevent cable shifting . In angled or transition sections, cables should be secured to the tray's transverse members to avoid mechanical stress .
