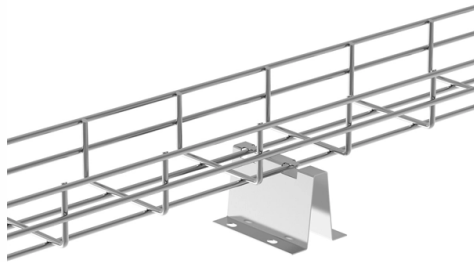

- **Circuit Breaker Testing:** Manual testing of MCBs and RCDs should be performed periodically to verify proper tripping and mechanical operation. This prevents mechanical sticking and ensures reliable protection during faults .
- **Electrical Safety Tests:** Insulation resistance testing, leakage current testing, and other electrical safety checks should be conducted regularly to confirm the integrity of the system .
