Common Installation Locations

Indoor Areas: Distribution boxes are often installed in electrical rooms, basements, utility closets, or hallways where they are protected from moisture, dust, and physical damage. These locations allow easy access for maintenance and inspection while keeping the box out of the way of daily activities .

Wall-Mounted Installations: Many boxes are mounted on walls, either on the surface (open installation) or recessed into the wall (concealed installation). Surface-mounted boxes provide easier access and visibility, while concealed boxes improve aesthetics but may be harder to service .

Outdoor Areas: For outdoor lighting circuits, boxes must be installed in weatherproof enclosures with appropriate IP or NEMA ratings (e.g., IP66 or NEMA 4X) to protect against rain, dust, and UV exposure. These are commonly used for street lighting, gardens, or industrial outdoor areas .

Installation Considerations

- **Height and Accessibility:** Typically installed at a height of around 1.5 meters to allow convenient access for operation and maintenance .
- **Ventilation and Dryness:** Boxes should be placed in dry, well-ventilated areas to prevent overheating and moisture damage .
