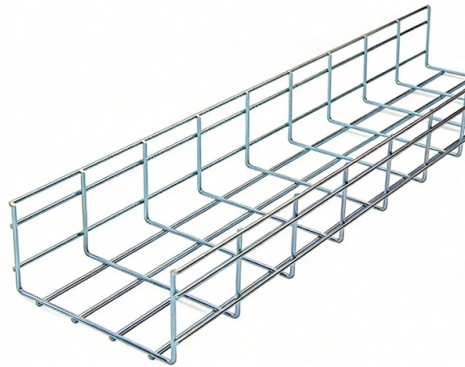


Wiring method for fiber optic cable patching junction boxes



Article Overview

Fiber optic patching in junction boxes requires careful routing, length control, bend radius management, proper labeling, and testing to ensure signal integrity and maintainable installations.

Patch Cable Routing and Management

When wiring fiber optic patch cables in junction boxes or ODFs, follow these key principles:

- **Routing:** Patch cables should run horizontally below the optical distribution module (ODM) and vertically to the corresponding terminal without crossing or hanging between spools. Inside the ODF frame, each patch cable should coil on a single spool only, avoiding multiple wraps or tangles .
- **Bend Radius:** Maintain a minimum bend radius of 400mm for all patch cables to prevent signal loss or fiber damage .
- **Length Control:** Use patch cables with a surplus of no more than 50cm from the splitter to the user's fiber port. Typical lengths are 1m, 2m, 2.5m, or 3m, with shorter 50cm cables for user terminal boxes . Emergency extra lengths should be properly managed on inner trays without obstructing future patching .

Connector and Patch Cable Selection

- Choose patch cables based on the connector types at the splitter and distribution box, such as SC-SC, FC-FC, or SC-FC .
